THE TRIP TO IRELAND

The Grand Councils were saddened by the passing of RE Sir Knight William Orr who had served as the Grand Representative of the Grand Council in the USA near the Grand Council for over 15 years. However, this sad event led to a most pleasant one. At the Grand Council of Knight Masons in Ballymoney ME Great Chief Edward Patrick Fagan, Jr. commissioned ME Sir Knight Bernard V A Woods as our Grand Representative. MESK Woods thanked MESK Fagan and expressed his pleasure at being honored by the appointment.

ME Sir Knight Bernard V.A. Woods is well known by our Grand Council. He was made an honorary member of Virginia Council No. 12 during a visit to the Council on March 17, 1998 while he was Grand Scribe. MESK Thurman C. Pace, Jr. during his visit to Ireland,

created ME Woods a PGSK, and, in 2008, MESK G. Kent Elkins presented the Grand Star of a Past Great Chief. During the Quarterly Meeting, Great Chief Edward Patrick Fagan, Jr. was surprised to be escorted before Great Chief Bernard VA Woods. MESK Woods then read a citation appointing MESK Fagan a Past Grand Senior Knight. The Grand Senior Knight is the highest progressive office in the Grand Council and appointment as PGSK is a high honor. It was noted that MESK Woods



had to stretch to place the cordon about MESK Fagan's neck, but as can be seen, the investiture was accomplished without any problems.

Recently the Grand Council has created an additional award – the Grand Knight Mason. This award is limited to two presentations per year, however, MESK Woods added one additional one for this year in creating MESK Douglas L. Jordan a Grand Knight Mason, *Honoris*



Causa. MESK Jordan has served as the Grand Representative of the Grand Council near the USA since 2003 and has visited the Grand Council meetings on several occasions.

Following the meeting in Ballymoney, the Great Chief and Grand Scribe traveled to London to witness the institution of two councils of Knight Masons in Mark Mason's Hall. The opportunity was taken to get a picture of the travelers along with MESK Woods and Deputy Great Chief RESK Timothy J. Coulter. In the picture MESK Jordan is wearing the jewel of a Grand Knight Mason.
